

PROCEEDINGS OF THE FRANKLIN COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS

May 1, 2017

Be it duly noted these minutes of 5/1/17 are UNOFFICIAL minutes.

The Board of Supervisors met in regular session at 8:30AM with Board members Gary McVicker-Chairman, Corey Eberling and Michael Nolte present.

Motion by Eberling, seconded by Nolte, approves the agenda as submitted. All ayes, motion carried.

Motion by Eberling, seconded by Nolte, approves the minutes of April 24, 2017. All ayes. Motion carried.

Committee Updates: Cherokee Mental Health and Central Iowa Juvenile Detention

Motion by Eberling, seconded by Nolte, approves relevies for Joint Drainage Districts in Hardin and Franklin Counties, Hardin Control County:

Motion by McVicker, seconded by Nolte, adopts Resolution #2017-16: Franklin County Noxious Weed Control Summer of 2017. Resolution reads as follows:

- 1) That each owner and each person in the possession or control of any land shall cut, burn or otherwise destroy all noxious weeds thereon, as defined in this Chapter, as such times in each year and in such manner as shall prevent said weeds from blooming bearing seeds or coming to maturity, and shall keep said lands free from such growth of any other seeds as shall render the streets or highways adjoining said land unsafe for public travel. Noxious weeds shall be cut, burned or otherwise destroyed on or before the following date and as often thereafter as necessary to prevent seed production:
June 15: Leafy spurge; Marijuana Plants; Perennial Pepper-grass; Buckthorn Rhamnus, not to include Rhamnus Frangula; Sour Dock Perennial Smooth Dock Perennial, Sheep Sorrel Perennial, Japanese Knotweed, Canadian Thistle; Russian Knapweed; Buckhorn; Perennial, Wild Mustard Annual, European Morning Glory or Field Bindweed; Wild Carrot Biennial, also known as Queen Anne’s Lace; Poison Hemlock, Multiflora Rose, Common and Giant Ragweed wild parsnip, Horse Nettle; Perennial Sow Thistle; Quack Grass; Butterprint Annual; Cocklebur; Bull Thistle; Wild Sunflower Annual; Teasel Biennial; Puncture Vine Annual; Shattercane Annual and all other species of Thistles belonging in genera of Cirsium and Carduus.
- 2) That each owner and each person in the possession or control of land including right of way in Franklin County infested with any noxious weeds listed above shall adopt a program of weed destruction described by the Weed Commissioner which in five years may be expected to destroy and will immediately keep under control such infestations of said noxious weeds.
- 3) That if the owners or persons in possession or control of any land including right of way in Franklin County fail to comply with the foregoing orders, the Weed Commissioner shall cause this to be done and the expense of said work, including cost of serving notice and other costs, if any, to be assessed against the real estate. Applicable County or State ordinances whatever is more stringent can be implemented.
- 4) It will be the responsibility of each owner and each person in the possession or control of land to destroy said weeds in Franklin County Secondary Road ditches.
- 5) The County Auditor be and is hereby directed to cause notice of the making and entering the foregoing order by one publication in each of the official newspapers of the County.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Franklin County be designated as a weed control unit.

Motion by Eberling, seconded by Nolte, adopts Resolution #2017-17: Mental Health Month 2017. Resolution reads as follows:

WHEREAS, mental health is essential to everyone's overall health and well-being; and
WHEREAS, mental illnesses are real and prevalent in our nation, and half of us will have a mental health diagnosis at some point in our lives; and
WHEREAS, all Americans experience times of difficulty and stress in their lives, and should feel comfortable in seeking help and support to manage these times; and
WHEREAS, engaging in prevention, early identification, and early intervention are as effective ways to reduce the burden of mental illnesses as they are to reduce the burden of other chronic conditions; and
WHEREAS, there is a strong body of research that identifies behavioral health risks and supports specific tools that all Americans can use to protect their health and well-being; and
WHEREAS, with effective treatment before Stage 4, all individuals with mental illnesses – even serious mental illnesses - can make progress toward recovery and lead full, productive lives; and
WHEREAS, jails and prisons have often become the default places of custodial care for even nonviolent people with serious mental illnesses; and
WHEREAS, each business, school, government agency, healthcare provider, organization and citizen has a responsibility to promote mental health and well-being for all.
THEREFORE, I Gary McVicker, do hereby proclaim May 2017 as Mental Health Month. As the Chair of the Franklin County Board of Supervisors, I also call upon the citizens, government agencies, public and private institutions, businesses and schools to recommit our community to increasing awareness and understanding of mental health, the steps our citizens can take to protect their mental health, and the need for appropriate and accessible services for all people with mental illnesses at all stages, and especially before stage 4.
