

PROCEEDINGS OF THE FRANKLIN COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS

May 22, 2017

Be it duly noted these minutes of May 22, 2017 are UNOFFICIAL minutes.

The Board of Supervisors met in regular session at 8:30AM with Board members Gary McVicker-Chairman and Corey Eberling present; Michael Nolte present via phone.

Motion by Eberling, seconded by Nolte, approves the agenda as submitted. All ayes, motion carried.

Motion by Nolte, seconded by Eberling, approves the minutes of May 15, 2017. All ayes. Motion carried.

Committee Updates: NIACOG; NIVC; FCDA; Hampton Public Library Open House

Public comments: Herman Suntken stopped to check on a repair in JDD 3-111. Upon investigating WO #56 had been submitted regarding this inquiry. No action taken.

Todd Wiley, Benton County Supervisor, presented information, via phone, on a Joint Agency Agreement between multiple counties regarding Iowa Watershed Approach Project grant dollars. More information is needed in order to make a decision. No action taken.

Motion by Eberling, seconded by Nolte, approves a Fireworks Permit to Francesca Koenig retroactive to May 16, 2017 where she displayed fireworks at 1510 110th St, Hampton. All ayes. Motion carried.

Motion by Eberling, seconded by Nolte, approves claims for period ending 5/21/17. All ayes. Motion carried.

Motion by Eberling, seconded by Nolte, rescinds Resolution 2003-58: Imposing a Filing Fee for Fireworks Permit Applications. Eberling-Ayes, McVicker-Aye, Nolte-Aye. Resolution duly adopted.

Motion by Nolte, seconded by Eberling, adopts Resolution 2017-19: Imposing a Filing Fee for Fireworks Permit Applications to the Franklin County Board of Supervisors outside the State Permitted Dates. Said Resolution reads as follows:

RESOLUTION IMPOSING A FILING FEE FOR FIREWORKS PERMIT APPLICATION TO THE FRANKLIN COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS

WHEREAS, the Franklin County Board of Supervisors receive numerous applications concerning the issuance of fireworks permits by residence of Franklin County; and

WHEREAS, the Franklin County Auditor and Franklin County Board of Supervisors do expend time and expense in the issuance of the fireworks permits; and

WHEREAS, the Franklin County Board of Supervisors believe that the County should be reimbursed for the expenditure of time and funds involved in the issuance of these permits.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF FRANKLIN COUNTY THAT:

A filing fee of \$10.00 shall be assessed to all fireworks permit applications filed outside of the State permitted dates June 1-July 8 and December 10-January 3, per Iowa Code SF489.

Any application for a fireworks permit not accompanied by a \$10.00 filing fee shall not be considered for issuance by the Franklin County Board of Supervisors.

The filing fee is a non-returnable fee for the consideration of the permit and will not be returned in the event of a non-issuance of the fireworks permit.

If a said County wide burn ban is in place, all permits shall be null and void, or another date may be applied for with no added fee.

Effective May 22, 2017.

Said Resolution replaces Resolution 2003-58.

ADOPTED this May 22, 2017 with the vote thereon being as follows:

Eberling-Aye, McVicker-Aye, Nolte-Aye. Resolution duly adopted.

Motion by Eberling, seconded by Nolte, adopts Iowa Retail Cigarette/Tobacco/Nicotine/Vapor Permit Applications for Dudley's Corner-Latimer and Dows Property Group-Dows effective 7/1/17-6/30/18. All ayes. Motion carried.

Motion by Eberling, seconded by Nolte, adjourns at 10:55 AM, until May 30, 2017. All ayes. Motion carried.
